Submission Guidelines

FOR BOOKS PUBLISHED & COPYRIGHTED IN 2016

The Anisfield-Wolf Book Awards, which recognize outstanding works that contribute to our understanding of racism and human diversity, is accepting entries through December 31, 2016. Prizes are given for both fiction, poetry and non-fiction, with winners being announced in the spring. The awards are presented by the Cleveland Foundation.

Award recipients traditionally receive a monetary gift of \$10,000 from the Anisfield-Wolf Fund. Now in its 81st year, the Anisfield-Wolf Book Awards continues to be the only American book award designed specifically to recognize works addressing issues of racism and diversity.

Eligibility

To be eligible, books must be written in English and published and copyrighted in 2016. Plays and screenplays are not eligible, nor are works in progress. Manuscripts and self-published works are not eligible.


